



Oldest Male Survivor visits LAMH

The Museum welcomed the return visit of Leopold Engleitner, the now 103 year old Austrian Holocaust survivor and Jehovah's Witness. Mr. Engleitner, the oldest known male concentration camp survivor, recounted his experiences in two sold out events.

As a result of Mr. Engleitner's previous visit in 2006, the Museum acquired an exhibit detailing the Nazi persecution of Jehovah's Witnesses. It is now part of our permanent collection.
